I took about 20 pictures, and where possible, those will be placed side by side in a photo collage in the pages following the newsletter.

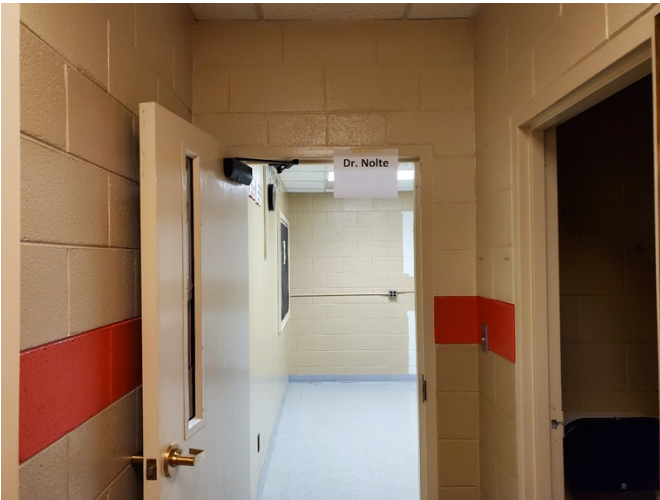
Thanks to Trevor Putnam and Bill Nolte for their cooperation in allowing the photography.

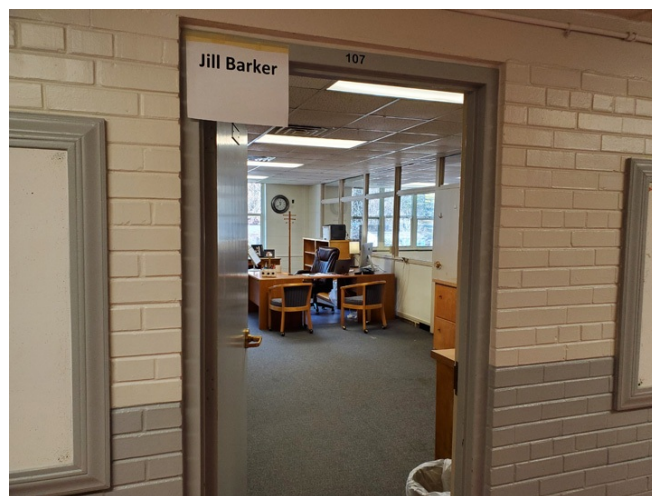
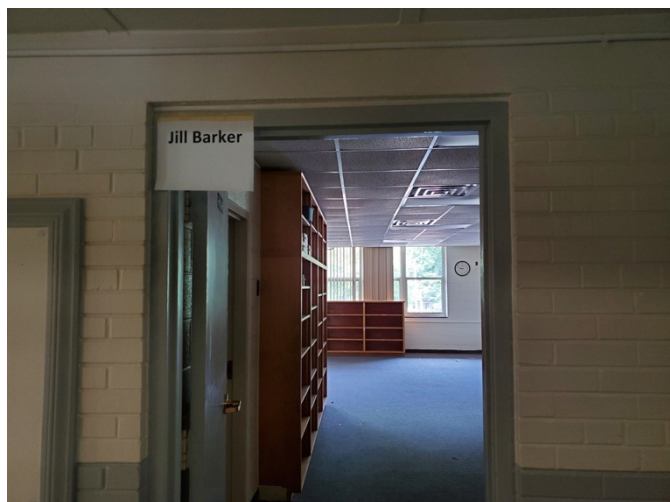

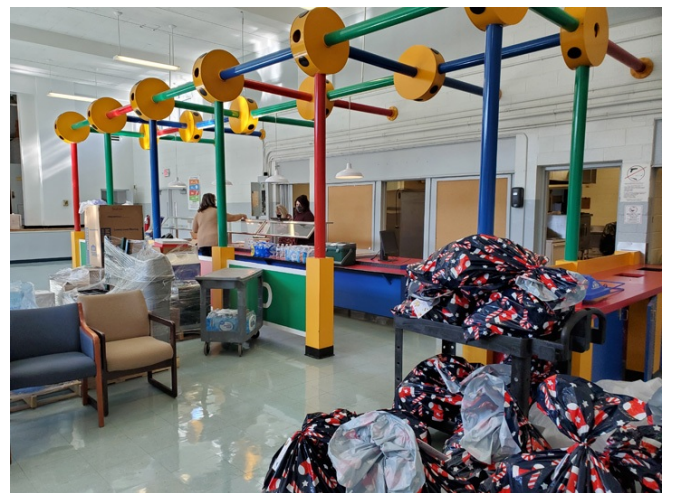
